

# PARTIAL TIMELINE OF CARBON-FREE GENERATION INTEGRATION:

## MMWEC & MEMBER UTILITIES

2013

4 MW Ashburnham MLP solar array comes online

2013

MMWEC enters into long-term contract for 11.56 MW from 6 small hydro plants; 13 Members participate

2013

MMWEC contracts for 37.5 MW from Hancock Wind project in Maine; 17 MMWEC Members participate

2014

3 MW Templeton MLP solar project comes online

2016

2 MW Sterling MLP energy storage project comes online; 2 MW solar/2 MW storage project online in 2018

2018

Ipswich MLP signs contract for 784 kW solar project

2018

Three MMWEC Members install energy storage totaling 5.1 MW

2019

Four MMWEC Members install energy storage totaling 8 MW

2019

Two MMWEC Members participate in 5 MW Holiday Hill wind project

2019

Seabrook Station operating license extended by 20 years to 2050

2019

Remaining nuclear debt paid off; only known public power utility/joint action agency to own nuclear debt-free

2019

Berkshire Wind project expanded; two 2.3 MW turbines bring project to 19.6 MW

2019

MMWEC works with DOER to create new MLP Solar Rebate Program; 17 MMWEC Members participate

2019

MMWEC sells its 22 MW share of the oil-fired Wyman Unit 4 plant in Maine; output of the plant had been sold to 12 MMWEC Members

2020

MMWEC, CMEEC sign power flow rights agreements with Hydro Quebec; MMWEC signs power deal with Hydro Quebec providing 19 MMWEC Members with 15 MW of clean power

2021

Six municipal utilities to participate in 7 MW solar project on MMWEC campus
